CHURCHSAFE / CHILD PROTECTION TRAINING

In keeping with the guidelines of the Safe Ministry to Children Canon (adopted at Synod 2017), licensing and diocesan policy requirements and our commitment to safe ministry in the diocese, it is a requirement that those who have not attended Churchsafe since September 2015, **must do so before 31 December.**

While it is acknowledged by the diocese that there are several options of child protection and protective behaviours training available in the community, it is a requirement of the General Synod office that all church workers attend training that is accredited by and, specific to the Anglican Church.
