



RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF WOLLASTON 2011

Approved by: The Perth Diocesan Trustees and Diocesan Council

12 November 2009

PREAMBLE

- 1 The establishment founded in Perth in 1957 as the John Wollaston Theological College and known as “Wollaston College” and “Wollaston College Conference Centre” shall continue to be conducted by the Anglican Church of Australia in the Diocese of Perth as “Wollaston”.

OBJECTS

- 2 Wollaston is to be used for all or any of the purposes of providing:
 - a facilities and resources for theological and spiritual training, education and study;
 - b facilities and resources for religious education and study;
 - c facilities for public worship and meditation;
 - d a place of residence for a minister of religion or for a religious order or for staff of the centre; and
 - e a retreat and conference facility for the Diocese, the Church and the community.

MANAGEMENT

The general management of Wollaston, excluding the religious education functions, is hereby vested in a Management Committee.

- 3 The Management Committee will consist of: the Warden of Wollaston Theological College, the Diocesan Property Service Manager and the Diocesan Secretary.
- 4 Staff working in the Wollaston Education Centre will report directly to the Warden of Wollaston Theological College and staff working in the Wollaston Conference Centre and maintenance and cleaning staff will report to Diocesan Property Service Manager.
- 5 The Management Committee will present to each general session of Synod an Annual Report and a set of financial statements, showing the Wollaston financial transactions for the year ended the previous 30 April and the Wollaston financial position as at that date.
- 6 The Management Committee, in consultation with the Archbishop’s Commission on Education, will present, for approval to Diocesan Council an annual budget as it considers proper to facilitate the objects of Wollaston by 31 March.

AMENDMENT OF RULES

- 7 These Rules are to be reviewed by Diocesan Council from time to time.
