The following conditions apply in respect to the transfer of the Diocesan Library to Murdoch University be approved:

That the Diocese make the Diocesan Library collection of the Anglican Institute of Theology available on loan to the Murdoch University Library for the support of the University's Theological Studies Programme, on the following conditions:

1. The books, periodicals and other materials in the Diocesan Library may be physically integrated into the Murdoch Library.
2. Anything from the Diocesan Library collection that is not required at Murdoch will be retained by the Anglican Institute of Theology.
3. The Murdoch University Library will, by negotiation through the Perth College of Divinity, enable Anglican clergy to enrol as borrowers for no fee and members of the Anglican Church to enrol as borrowers on the best terms that the Library can from time to time offer.
4. Subject to the determination of the Diocesan Council, the council will each year make some payment to the Murdoch Library to assist in the development of that Library's Theology collection.
5. If, within the next twenty-five years, Murdoch University ceases to maintain a programme of Theological Studies that meets the educational requirements for Anglican candidates for ordination, the Murdoch Library shall return to the diocese all remaining books, periodicals and other materials from the Diocesan Library collection.
6. After the loan has run for twenty-five years, all material from the Diocesan Library collection shall remain in the Murdoch Library as a permanent gift. Should Murdoch University, at any time thereafter, cease to maintain a programme of Theological Studies that meets the educational requirements for Anglican ordination, the University and the Diocese shall consult about the best way in which any scheme of tertiary theological study in which the Anglican Church participates may be enabled to use the Theology collection of the Murdoch Library.
